Govindacharya said: "The question of formalising anything. The name of the BJP will be kept general secretary Mr. Thakre. He will lead the assistance and senior status and experienced members." "I am not senior party like Mr. Atal Behari and Dr. M. K. M. Singh are not Mr. Thakre's son," Mr. Pujari asked. To that, Mr. Govindacharya said: "The BJP does not have a narrow casteist or a communal point of view; it is based on nationalist considerations. Such changes or equations do not have much impact on either party workers or its supporters."

The next query was: "There are

a lot of misconceptions related to issues like nationalism, self-reliance, poverty, fear and corruption, both in the country and also in the BJP. Why do one find so much dissent within the party on these issues?"

"Misconception and dissent are not within the party. Misconception is only in the minds of people like you. Our slogan of swadeshi is dictated by domestic compulsions, but that does not mean negation of economic liberalisation in the international context. If we don't talk of nationalism and self-reliance in the country then it will reduce our votebank; at the same time if we don't speak of economic liberalisation at international fairs

then our international stature gets affected." The next query: "This means that on the one hand BJP is deceiving not only its supporters but also the people of the country, and on the other hand it is trying to strike a compromise with globalisation?"

"This is our political strategy; I will not elaborate more on this."

But the questioner persisted: "The RSS is building up a mass movement on nationalism. The Bharatiya Mazdoor Sangh and other such organisations are also engaged in the task of accelerating this movement. One of your own leaders is supposed to be the spokesperson and representative of this swadeshi campaign at international fairs. Even the

Left parties are joining the BJP in this movement. All this is somewhat positive and fact aware."

"There is no single company entering the Swadeshi Movement place and it is difficult to say. I hope there was a big Euro and D.
